Privacy and Cookie Policy

Introduction

The phrases "Unique Property Group", "us" or "we" shall, when used herein, mean those brands and trading names of Unique Property Group on behalf of and in respect of whom this statement is made.

By using Unique Property Group websites and mobile applications or otherwise providing your personal information to Unique Property Group, you agree to the collection, use and sharing of your information in accordance with this statement. Please read this Privacy Statement carefully and contact us if you have any questions.

Personal information is information, or any combination of separate pieces of information, that could be used to identify you. We will treat your personal information as confidential and in accordance with applicable data protection legislation and your personal information will only be shared with others in accordance with this Privacy Notice.

What information de we collect?

We will collect your full name and contact details (such as phone number, email address and postal address) from you whenever you engage with us.

In addition, if we are providing a service to you, or on your behalf, where we are required to do so by law, we will collect information relating to your identity, which will be at least one form of photographic identification (such as a passport, a driving licence or an identification card) and one form of documentation with proof of your place of residence (such as a recent utility bill).

We will also confirm whether you have any relatives or close connections working at Unique Property Group so that we can consider potential conflict of interests and if identified how to manage these, in accordance with our statutory and regulatory obligations.

Dependent upon the service we are providing to you (or on your behalf) we may collect other information:

Buying through us:

We may collect personal information relating to any specific requirements you may have in relation to a property so that we can find a property that is suitable for your needs.

Information collected online

We use cookies and other technologies to collect information when you visit our sites, view our online advertisements or promotions, or use our mobile applications or other services.

The following are examples of information we may collect with these technologies:

- Information about your device browser and operating system.
- IP address
- Web pages you view
- Links you click
- Unique Property Group emails you open

How do we use this information?

We use the information we collect to provide you products, offers and services, to deliver to you advertisements, offers or other content tailored to your interests, and to conduct other Unique Property Group business operations.

Unique Property Group will only process your information in pursuance of our legitimate interest (or those of a third party) if we receive any requests related to, for example, a product or service, a call-back, or specific marketing materials; we will use your personal information to fulfil your request.

The following are examples of how we may use the information we collect:

Answer your questions or respond to your requests

- Send you email and/or postal messages and telephone you with information about Unique Property Group brands and other content we think may
 be of interest to you. You have the right to opt out of receiving this information at any time.
- Develop and provide Marketing tailored to your interests, including interest-based marketing.
- Personalise your experience on our websites by presenting products and information tailored to you
- For employment-related purposes
- Where we need information to perform the contract we have entered into with you
- Where we need to comply with a legal obligation
- We will share personal information with our regulators, governmental or quasi-governmental organisations, law enforcement authorities and with courts, tribunals and arbitrators as may be required from time to time in order to comply with our regulatory and legal obligations;
- Where we use third party services providers who process personal information on our behalf in order to provide services to us. This includes IT systems providers and IT contractors as well as third party referencing or screening agencies for the purposes of the prevention and detection of crime.
- We may share your personal information with any person working within Unique Property Group on a need to know basis to ensure we are able to perform our obligations to you.
- As part of the sale of a Unique Property Group brand to another company.

Third party providers

We engage third-party service providers to perform a variety of business operations on our behalf. In so doing, we may share your personal information with them. We provide our service providers with only the personal information they need in order to perform the services we request, and we contractually require that they protect this information appropriately and not use it for any other purpose.

For example, we may rely on a 3rd party service provider to:

- Fulfil your service requests and answer your questions.
- Host our sites and deliver our email or other communications.

- Manage payments or take other actions on our behalf.
- Analyse our data, sometimes combined with data from other sources, to send you communications.
- Conduct research and analyse data to improve our products, services and sites.
- Perform other services that we request.

How long do we keep your information?

We will retain Personal Information for the period necessary to fulfil the purposes outlined in this Privacy Statement, unless a longer retention period is required or permitted by law.

How do we keep the data secure?

We are committed to keeping personal information secure. We have implemented technical, administrative and physical procedures designed to protect personal information from loss, misuse or alteration.

We limit access to personal information to those who have a business need. We keep personal information only for so long as deemed reasonably necessary.

Your rights relating to your personal information

To the extent provided for by applicable law, you have certain rights in respect of the management of the personal data we hold about you.

- Be informed about how we use your personal information
- Obtain access to your personal information that we hold
- Request that your personal information is corrected if you believe it is incorrect, incomplete or inaccurate
- Request that we erase your personal information in the following circumstances:
- If Unique Property Group is continuing to process personal information beyond the period when it is necessary to do so for the purpose for which it was originally collected

- If Unique Property Group is relying on consent as the legal basis for processing and you withdraw consent
- If Unique Property Group is relying on legitimate interests as the legal basis for processing and you object to this processing and there is no
 overriding compelling ground which enables us continue with the processing
- If the personal information has been processed unlawfully (i.e. in breach of the requirements of the data protection legislation)
- If it is necessary to delete the personal information to comply with a legal obligation
- Ask us to restrict our data processing activities where you consider that:
- personal information is inaccurate
- our processing of your personal information is unlawful
- where we no longer need the personal information but you require us to keep it to enable you to establish, exercise or defend a legal claim
- where you have raised an objection to our use of your personal information
- Request a copy of certain personal information that you have provided to us in a commonly used electronic format. This right relates to personal
 information that you have provided to us that we need in order to perform our agreement with you and personal information where we are relying
 on consent to process your personal information
- Object to our processing of your personal information where we are relying on legitimate interests or exercise of a public interest task to make the
 processing lawful. If you raise an objection we will carry out an assessment to determine whether we have an overriding legitimate ground which
 entitles us to continue to process your personal information; and
- Not be subject to wholly automated decisions which produce legal effects or which could have a similarly significant effect on you.

Children's privacy

Our Sites are not directed to children under the age of thirteen and we do not knowingly collect personal information from children under the age of thirteen on our Sites.
